REGULAR SESSION

PULASKI COUNTY COUNCIL

The Pulaski County Council met in regular session Monday November 9, 2020, at 7:00PM at the Pulaski County Highway Garage training room. Councilmembers present were Ron DeSabatine, Scott Hinkle, Jerry Sullivan, Kathleen Thompson, and Brian Young with County Auditor Laura Wheeler. Councilmembers present by phone were Ken Boswell and Mike Tiede.

Also present were Derrick Stalbaum, Jim Jordan, Maurice Loehmer, Joe Moyer, John Masterson, Connie Ehrlich, Jennifer Knebel, Donald Ehrlich, Gail Lambert, Nathan Origer, and Jeff Richwine.

Vice-President Ron DeSabatine opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

IN RE: CDC

A public hearing opened for a tax abatement request from Derrick & Abbie Stalbaum for construction of a hog confinement feeding operation in Rich Grove Township. The tax abatement is for a 10-year period to lessen the burden of getting this operation up and running. Two resolutions presented for consideration—one requesting a Waiver of Non-compliance and the other requesting the tax abatement as follows:

COMPRISING APPROXIMATELY 40.5800 ACRES LOCATED IN THE VICINITY OF 2597 NORTH 1050 WEST, MEDARYVILLE, INDIANA, IN THE NORTHWEST AND NORTHEAST CORNERS OF SECTION 31 OF RICH GROVE CIVIL TOWNSHIP (R3W, T31N) (DEPICTED IN EXHIBIT C ATTACHED TO AND MADE A PART OF THIS RESOLUTION)

FOR A PERIOD OF 20 YEARS AND WILL CONSIDER CONFIRMING THIS FINDING AND GRANTING A TAX ABATEMENT ON THIS NINTH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 2020;

WHEREAS THE PETITIONERS HAVE REQUESTED A TEN-YEAR PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT FOR REDEVELOPMENT OR REHABILITATION ACTIVITIES AS EVIDENCED BY EXHIBIT A, FORM SB-1/REAL PROPERTY, WHICH IS ATTACHED HERETO AND MADE A PART OF THIS RESOLUTION;

WHEREAS THE PETITIONERS HAVE BEGUN AFORESAID REDEVELOPMENT OR REHABILITATION ACTIVITIES PRIOR TO THIS DATE;

WHEREAS THE STATE OF INDIANA, IN *INDIANA CODE 6-1.1-12.1-11.3*, DOES PERMIT A WAIVER OF NON-COMPLIANCE, BY RESOLUTION, IN SUCH CIRCUMSTANCES AS THESE; AND

WHEREAS IT IS IN THE INTEREST OF PULASKI COUNTY TO RETAIN AND TO INCREASE LOCAL CAPITAL INVESTMENT AND JOB CREATION,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. THE COUNCIL FINDS THAT THE TOTALITY OF THE BENEFITS DESCRIBED FOR THE PROJECT JUSTIFY INCLUSION OF THE LISTED EQUIPMENT IN THE REQUESTED TAX ABATEMENT.

WHEREAS THE COUNTY COUNCIL DID PRELIMINARILY APPROVE, ON THE TWELFTH DAY OF OCTOBER 2020, THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED AREAS AS AN ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION AREA:

COMPRISING APPROXIMATELY 40.5800 ACRES LOCATED IN THE VICINITY OF 2597 NORTH 1050 WEST, MEDARYVILLE, INDIANA, IN THE NORTHWEST AND NORTHEAST CORNERS OF SECTION 31 OF RICH GROVE CIVIL TOWNSHIP (R3W, T31N) (DEPICTED IN EXHIBIT C ATTACHED TO AND MADE A PART OF THIS RESOLUTION)

FOR A PERIOD OF 20 YEARS;

WHEREAS THIS ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION AREA ALLOWS ABATEMENT OF PROPERTY TAXES ATTRIBUTABLE TO REDEVELOPMENT OR REHABILITATION ACTIVITIES AS DEFINED IN I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-1 AND PERMITTED UNDER I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-3.;

WHEREAS THE PETITIONERS HAVE REQUESTED A TEN-YEAR PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT FOR REDEVELOPMENT OR REHABILITATION ACTIVITIES AS EVIDENCED BY EXHIBIT A, FORM SB-1/REAL PROPERTY, WHICH IS ATTACHED HERETO AND MADE A PART OF THIS RESOLUTION;

WHEREAS THE COUNTY COUNCIL HAS ADOPTED A TAX-ABATEMENT WAIVER-OF-NONCOMPLIANCE RESOLUTION REGARDING THIS APPLICATION; AND

WHEREAS ALL EVIDENCE AND TESTIMONY CONCERNING THE ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION AREA AND THIS APPLICATION FOR TAX ABATEMENT WERE CONSIDERED BY THE COUNCIL,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. THE AFORESAID PARCELS ARE DESIGNATED AS AN ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION AREA FOR A PERIOD OF TWENTY YEARS, CONFIRMING THE PRIOR RESOLUTION, 2020-11.
- 2. THE TOTALITY OF THE BENEFITS DESCRIBED FOR THE PROJECT ARE SUFFICIENT TO JUSTIFY TAX ABATEMENT IN THE DESIGNATED AREA FOR A TEN-YEAR PERIOD, AS OUTLINED IN EXHIBIT B, WHICH IS ATTACHED HERETO AND MADE A PART OF THIS RESOLUTION, FOR DERRICK W. STALBAUM & ABBIE E. STALBAUM, H. & W., FOR REDEVELOPMENT OR REHABILITATION ACTIVITIES, AS DESCRIBED IN THE ATTACHED FORM SB-1/REAL ESTATE, EXHIBIT A.
- 3. THE COUNCIL, HAVING MADE ITS FINDINGS IN THE AFFIRMATIVE, HEREBY APPROVES THE AFORESAID TAX ABATEMENT.
- 4. A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE FILED WITH THE COUNTY ASSESSOR.

Stalbaum presented a property tax average of \$16,480.00 from eleven sites identical to his finished operation. County Assessor estimated his taxes at \$31,200.00 for the first year. With the abatement, his taxes are estimated at \$16,000.00 for the first year.

After some deliberation, Mike Tiede made a motion to approve the two resolutions as presented, Ken Boswell seconded and motion carried 6-1 with Brian Young dissenting.

These will eliminate the chance of human error from manually inputting information and reduce the amount of printer paper needed. Encoders are \$125.00 for each of the nine poll pads and \$1,500.00 maintenance per election. Kathi Thompson made a motion to approve the purchase of encoders for a total cost of \$1,125.00, Ken Boswell seconded and motion carried unanimously.

The 2021 County MATRIX Ordinance for Salaries and Wages presented as follows:

2021 County Matrix Ordinance for Salaries and Wages

BE IT ORDAINED THE INDIANA LEGISLATURE ADOPTED I.C. 36-2-3 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE PULASKI COUNTY COUNCIL AS THE GOVERNING FISCAL BODY OF PULASKI COUNTY; AND

WHEREAS, I.C. 36-2-5-3 GRANTS THE PULASKI COUNTY COUNCIL THE POWER TO: FIX THE NUMBER OF OFFICERS, DEPUTIES, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES; DESCRIBED AND CLASSIFY POSITIONS AND SERVICES; ADOPT SCHEDULES OF COMPENSATION; AND HIRE OR CONTRACT WITH PERSONS TO ASSIST IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF SCHEDULES OF COMPENSATION; AND

WHEREAS, I.C. 36-2-5-11 REQUIRES THE COUNTY FISCAL BODY TO ADOPT AN ORDINANCE SETTING FOR THE COMPENSATION OF ALL OFFICERS, DEPUTIES, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES AS WELL AS SET THE NUMBER OF DEPUTIES, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES FOR EACH OFFICE, DEPARTMENT, COMMISSION, OR AGENCY; AND

WHEREAS, I.C. 2-3.5-2-10 ALLOWS FOR A DEFINITION OF SALARY AS THE FIXED SALARY OR THE PER DIEM ALLOWANCE WHICH IS TREATED AS COMPENSATION TO THE EMPLOYEE FOR FEDERAL INCOME TAX PURPOSES. THIS ORDINANCE DEFINES SALARY AS A FIXED ANNUAL SET COMPENSATION FOR ALL SERVICES RENDERED BY THAT EMPLOYEE AND WILL ONLY BE USED FOR EMPLOYEES THAT ARE DEEMED EXEMPT FROM THE FLSA (FAIR LABOR STANDARDS ACT). EMPLOYEES THAT ARE DEFINED AS NON-EXEMPT WILL BE PAID AN HOURLY RATE AND WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR OVERTIME AND COMPENSATION TIME UNDER THE FLSA AS SET FORTH IN THE CURRENT PULASKI COUNTY PERSONNEL POLICY HANDBOOK; AND

WHEREAS, IT IS NECESSARY TO SET FORTH THE APPROPRIATED AMOUNT FOR EACH POSITION SET FORTH IN THIS ORDINANCE FOR AN HOURLY RATE EMPLOYEE, AND IT SHOULD BE KNOWN THAT THE APPROPRIATED AMOUNT FOR A POSITION IS NOT A FIXED SALARY AND IS NOT GUARANTEED LEVEL OF COMPENSATION TO THE EMPLOYEE HOLDING THAT POSITION, BUT IS SIMPLY AN AMOUNT BEING HELD IN THE BUDGET TO PAY THE WAGES OF THE HOURLY RATE FOR THAT POSITION; AND

WHEREAS, THE PAY PERIOD FOR PULASKI COUNTY EMPLOYEES SHALL BE ON A BI-WEEKLY BASIS; AND

WHEREAS, A PART-TIME EMPLOYEE SHALL NOT EXCEED 28 HOURS OF WORK PER PAY WEEK; AND

WHEREAS, THE PULASKI COUNTY COUNCIL APPROVES AND INCORPORATED THE PULASKI COUNTY PERSONNEL POLICY HANDBOOK DATED SEPTEMBER 11, 2017 AND AMENDMENTS INTO THIS ORDINANCE. THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS SET FORTH IN SAID POLICY HANDBOOK.

WHEREAS, the Pulaski County Council has voted to disregard *Article XI, Grandfathered Pay, of the Pulaski County Council's Salary Matrix Rules adopted June 11, 2018* for the purpose of giving all employees of the County a raise for the 2021 calendar year, the policy otherwise remains unchanged.

FURTHER THEREFORE BE IT ORDINAED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF PULASKI COUNTY, INDIANA THAT THE ORDINANCE AFFIXING THE NUMBER AND COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEES OF THE COUNTY FROM THE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2021 TO DECEMBER 31, 2021, INCLUDING ALL OFFICERS, DEPUTIES, ASSISTANTS, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES WHOSE SALARY OR HOURLY WAGE IS COMPRISED OF FUNDS PAYABLE FROM ANY COUNTY FUND OR BUDGET EXCEPT AS PROVIDED BY I.C. 36-2-5; ARE HEREBY SOLIDLY FIXED AT THE FOLLOWING MAXIMUM LEVEL OF SALARY COMPENSATION SHOWN BELOW. ALL PAYMENTS MADE PURSUANT TO THIS ORDINANCE ARE CONTINGENT UPON STRICT COMPLIANCE WITH AND ADHERENCE TO THE PULASKI COUNTY PERSONNEL POLICY HANDBOOK.

Jerry Sullivan made a motion to approve the 2021 MATIX ordinance as presented, Ronald DeSabatine seconded and motion carried unanimously.
