REGULAR SESSION

PULASKI COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

The Pulaski County Commissioners met in regular session Monday August 1, 2022 6:00pm at the Pulaski County Highway Garage training room. Commissioners present were Charles Mellon, Maurice Loehmer, Michael McClure with County Auditor Laura Wheeler and County Attorney Kevin Tankersley.

Also present were Nathan Origer, Laura Wilder, Daryn Wilder, Gail Lambert, Connie Ehrlich, JoLynn Behny, Chris Brucker, Joe Moyer, Jeff Richwine, and Chris Schramm.

President Mellon opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

IN RE: NATHAN ORIGER, CDC

Justice Center construction, work release facility and Highway Roof updates with no significant issues.

The Courthouse project survey of all departments regarding basic programming, entrance security, and service counters completed. Tonn & Blank will use this information to update cost estimates so County can move forward with bond issuance and more detailed/comprehensive drawings. Construction and funding options for the remodeling of the west annex to accommodate the Health Department being considered.

CDC restructuring and internet service mentioned briefly.

DeGroot Technology included in network administration group discussed. Charles Mellon made the motion to add DTS to this group, Maurice Loehmer seconded and motion carried unanimously.

IN RE: OTHER BUSINESS

Maurice Loehmer made a motion to approve and sign claims and payroll #15 as presented, Michael McClure seconded and motion carried unanimously.

Maurice Loehmer made a motion to approve and sign July 18, 2022 regular session minutes as presented, Michael McClure seconded and motion carried unanimously.

Charles Mellon made a motion to table proposed Ordinance 2022-06: Designating Meridian Street as a One-Way Street until next Joint Session. Michael McClure seconded and motion carried unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-07 to Preserve the Location of and Prevent Damage to Corner Markers presented for review and approval and reads as follows:

PULASKI COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2022-07

An Ordinance to Preserve the Location of and Prevent Damage to Section Corner Markers within Pulaski Co

WHEREAS, a Section Corner Ordinance is desirable to preserve the location of and prevent damage to section corner monument markers and high accuracy reference network (HARN) point markers within Pulaski County; and

WHEREAS, LC. 36-2-12-13 permits a County to adopt an ordinance prohibiting movement of or damage to section corner monument markers and HARN points and prescribing monetary penalties for violations thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF PULASKI COUNTY, THAT:

1. Except as provided by this Ordinance it shall be unlawful to any person to move, change, damage, or otherwise alter a monument marking a section corner without complying with the provisions of LC. 36-2-12-13.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to damage or remove a monument marking a section corner or HARN point. Any person who damages or removes a monument marking a corner or HARN point shall reimburse the County for the cost of repairing or replacing the monument or marker.
3. A person may, for excavation, mineral extraction, or other purposes related to the person's business, including the activities described in paragraph 5 of this Ordinance, temporarily remove a monument marking a corner. The person must notify the Pulaski County Surveyor in writing at least thirty (30) days prior to removing the monument. The person must, within a reasonable time, (as defined as the Pulaski County Commissioners) either replace the monument at his own expense utilizing a registered land Surveyor under the supervision of the Pulaski County Surveyor, or, if the Pulaski County Surveyor is not registered under LC. 25-21.5 or LC. 25-31, a registered person who is appointed by the Pulaski County Board of Commissioners under LC.36-2-12-11, or have the Pulaski
