Downy serviceberry (Amelanchier arborea) is an early-flowering, large shrub or small tree which typically grows 15-25' tall in cultivation. Its early summer fruits are relished by birds and mammals, while the thick canopy is a frequent nesting site for small birds. Serviceberry can be grown in full sun but does best with some late afternoon shade.

The **Redbud** (Cercis canadensis) grows from 20 to 30 feet tall and wide at maturity.

This tree grows at a fast rate of about 2 feet per year under ideal conditions.

The **Eastern Redbud** is a stunning spring bloomer that is native to North America.

These trees grow well in full sun or part shade. However, you will get the heaviest blooming from trees in full sun.





Arborvitae trees, also known as 'Smaragd' due to their Danish origins, grow in a narrow pyramid shape, eventually to 10-15 feet tall and 3-4 feet wide. Their size makes them ideal foundation plants and natural privacy screens in smaller yards and narrow spaces. These trees can grow up to 1-2 feet per year until established and then grow 6-9 inches per year. Arborvitae trees' dense green, scale-shaped foliage is colorful year-round and fans out in feather-like sprays.

The black walnut tree (Juglans nigra) is one of North America's most valuable and beautiful native trees. Black Walnut has long compound leaves that hold up to 23 leaflets arranged opposite each other and often lacking a leaflet at the apex. Bark is deeply ridged well out onto the branches. Fall color is bright yellow and leaf scars are heart shaped with 3 dots or "bundle scars" on each point. Fruits conspicuous green balls that are held from midsummer well into the fall exhibiting various stages of rot. Both fruits and leaves have a spicy citrus smell when crushed or scraped. It is also a good food source for wild life.







Colorado Blue Spruce (Picea pungens 'glauca') is a majestic evergreen when planted as a specimen tree or as a group. It is native to North America and is found in USDA growing zones 1 through 7. The blue spruce has blue-green colored needles and is a coniferous tree

White Pine (Pinus strobus) Lake States – Fast growing with soft, green-blue needles, 4" long. Prefers moderate drained soils, tolerates more shade than other pines. Excellent for windbreaks, sound barriers. Grows 80' to 100'.
